III. POLICY

- A. A course withdrawal is defined as an official separation from a given course initiated by the student any time after the Add/Drop deadline and before the course withdrawal deadline. Deadlines for course withdrawals are strictly adhered to. Specific dates are posted on the Academic Calendar. Students withdrawing from courses within the withdrawal period will automatically receive a grade of "W". The "W" has no effect on the student's grade point average. There is no refund for a course withdrawal.

- B. Withdrawing from a course may affect items such as financial aid eligibility, progress towards graduation, NCAA eligibility, housing status, involvement in campus activities, etc. It is recommended that you consult with the course instructor, your advisor, Student Financial Services and/or any other relevant faculty/staff before officially withdrawing from a course.

- C. When a student withdraws from a course, that enrollment falls under the course repeat policy. A student may repeat any course only once without permission, regardless of whether a grade or a W was earned. For more information, see the policy on repeating courses. It is the student's responsibility to withdraw officially from a course. Failure to withdraw formally may result in failing grades and dismissal. Procedures for withdrawal can be found on PAWS.

- D. During the traditional academic year, students may withdraw from a full semester course up to the ninth (9th) week of the semester. For courses in other formats (e.g., Maymester, summer session or winter session), students must withdraw by a date corresponding to 60% of the term. Deadlines for these withdrawals are strictly enforced. Specific dates are posted on the Academic Calendar.
